1. Open Google Chrome and go to **Settings**.

		Use your screen lock when filling in passwords If you share this device with others, you can use your screen lock to verify that it's you whenever you use a saved password
		Import passwords To import passwords to Google Password Manager on this device, select a CSV file.
		Export passwords After you've finished using the downloaded file, delete it so that others who use this device can't see your passwords.
		Add shortcut To get here quicker, add a shortcut to Google Password Manager
		Use passkeys across your Apple devices When on, passkeys are created in iCloud Keychain and are available across your Apple devices. When off, passkeys are created in your Chrome profile on this device.

- 1. Enter your device's password to export the passwords.
- 2. Save the **.CSV** file to your Documents folder.
- Once in your new Desktop, perform the same steps with the exception of Step 3. In this case you will click on Select File under Import passwords.

*Note - you should use extreme caution when handling this created file, as it is an unencrypted copy of your usernames and passwords for previously visited websites.
